Housing is a daunting field, given its very diverse set of subtopics from market performance to construction, to policy analysis. Fortunately, there is an abundance of data and perspectives on the housing industry – with much of it free. But where should one begin? The following is a guide to where to find many of the key data sets and publications on housing. All of the sources have national data and most have regional and/or metro-level data and analysis. Some sources cover smaller geographies.

# 1. Joint Center for Housing Studies of Harvard University (JCHS)

Broad range of papers on housing including its signature annual report: "The State of the Nation's Housing."

#### 8. National Association of Realtors (NAR)

Trade association with wide array of mostly for-sale housing data and commentary. Current data is free; historical data usually free for members. One of key annual reports is *Profile of Home Buyers and Sellers*.

#### 9. National Multifamily Housing Council (NMHC)

Trade association with papers, surveys, and commentaries covering wide range of topics mostly related to multifamily housing market and policy trends. Some research available only to members.

Trade organization focused on for-sale housing construction. Commentaries cover a variety of broad housing economics and construction topics.

Research center within the Urban Land Institute (commercial real estate trade association) focused on policy and affordability solutions. One of the signature research products is "Home Attainability Index." Some research only available for ULI members.
