Anthony S. (Tony) Levatino CRE, CCIM, SRA Senior Vice President, InterBank of Dallas, has over 48 years of real estate banking experience. Levatino's career started at the Lubbock National Bank, later he was recruited to be a V.P. at First National Bank in Dallas. Levatino then accepted a position as E.V.P. at RepublicBank Houston; six years later he was transferred to Austin, TX where he became EVP and Vice Chairman of both RepublicBank Austin and RepublicBank San Antonio. Levatino worked not only the Houston market but also at Austin and San Antonio markets over a 12-year period. NCNB acquired RepublicBank and transferred Levatino to Dallas as E.V.P. of the newly formed Asset Management Group. In this role, Levatino was charged with organizing, hiring and supervising up to 250 personnel to manage and dispose of over 6,500 foreclosed assets of \$4 billion under a contract with the FDIC. Five years later, Tony was recruited as the S.V.P. at Bank of America in Los Angeles to manage a Special Loan Asset Group totaling over \$8 billion dollars.

Currently, Tony holds the designations as a Counselor of Real Estate (CRE) and has served two years as Chair of the DFW Chapter of the Counselors of Real Estate. Tony also holds a designation as a Certified Commercial Investment Member (CCIM) of the National Association of Realtors. He is a member and an Advisory Board Member of the North Texas Commercial Association of Realtors. After taking five extensive courses through the Appraisal Institute, he earned the designation as a Senior Residential Appraiser (SRA).

Always possessing a passion for education, Tony was an instructor at the Southwest Graduate School of Banking at SMU in Dallas and for the Independent Bankers Association of Texas at U.T. Austin. He has had the honor of holding a class for the Federal Financial Institutions Examinations Council in Washington, D.C. He has held the position of Chair of the Dallas Fort Worth Chapter of Counselors of Real Estate and served two terms as Chairman of the American Bankers Real Estate Committee in Washington, D.C.

Levatino is a graduate of Texas Tech University with a BA degree; received a Graduate Certificate in Finance & a Graduate Certificate in Marketing at SMU. Levatino is a graduate of North Texas University's Certified Financial Planner School. He is a graduate of the Mortgage Bankers of America Income Lending and Advanced Income Lending School held at Michigan State. Levatino has held a Securities Series 7 and Series 66 license and a Texas Insurance License; inactive. He carries a National Mortgage License System license # NMLS ID # 1666186 and is also a Texas Licensed Real Estate Broker, License # 419920. Levatino served as a counselor under a contract to the Board of Directors of the Teacher Retirement System for the State of Texas in Austin, TX for seven years.

Levatino is honored to have served on various community and charity organizations. Early in his career, he served as the Chair of the March of Dimes in Houston & San Antonio; a Board member of the Laguna Gloria Museum in Austin. He is also a graduate of Leadership Austin. Levatino has also served two terms on the Board of Catholic Charities of Dallas; Managing Director of the Holy Trinity Catholic Church (HTCC), Dallas, an outreach ministry. With his wife, Sheila, formed a 501 C 3 Friends of Holy Trinity Catholic School to raise funds for the benefit of the school and the students. In addition, Levatino has served on the Pastoral Council of HTCC and also served as President of the St. Vincent de Paul Society; Chaired a Just Faith Program and a Bible study program. Levatino attended and is a graduate of the University of Dallas four year bible study program. Levatino headed an IRS Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program for those seeking help Earned Income Tax Credits. Currently, he serves on the Catholic Charities Dallas (CCD) Facilities and Real Estate Committee. In the past, he served on the CCD Board, the Finance Committee, the Thrift Store Committee, and the Brady Center committee. Tony has served three years on the Board of Governors of the Park City Club in Dallas.

Currently, Levatino is in his tenth year as a Director of the Catholic Housing Initiative (CHI), a non-profit 501 C 3 whose purpose is to provide housing for vulnerable seniors who are in need. All units in the six owned properties with over 900 units are rented at below-market rental rates, and most of the tenants are using housing vouchers. In addition, CHI has recently opened a 104-room former nursing home that has been rehabilitated as a Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) for the Homeless. Tony and his wife Sheila have been married 26 years and have seven adult children between the two, six son/daughter in laws and 12 grandchildren.
